Marina & Facilities

13-Lane Boat Launch

Need to launch your boat? The Port has the largest public boat launch in Washington state with 13 launching lanes. This facility accommodates all boating needs, from small power boats to kayaks, and provides an ADA accessible lane. A park adjoins the facility with open space for families to enjoy.



Escape to Everett: Guest Moorage

Beaches & Kiteboarding

Pigeon Creek Beach

After a one-mile walk or ride along Pigeon Creek Trail, just behind the Port's shipping terminals, visitors reach Pigeon Creek Beach and Viewpoint. The viewpoint offers a breathtaking view overlooking the serene saltwater beach. Don't forget to pack a lunch! The beach has picnic tables for a fun family outing.



Jetty Island Days (July through Labor Day) Great for Families

Come enjoy the wind and waves at the Port-owned Jetty Island – the longest sandy beach in the Puget Sound. Join nearly 50,000 beach goers who visit the island every summer to bask in the sun, play in the sand and swim in the warm shallow waters. The Jetty is a popular destination for the extreme sport of kiteboarding and is the perfect place to let your kites fly! Wildlife & Bird Watching

Jetty Island

Step into a world of wildlife, sandy beaches and marsh grasses that is home to more than 45 bird species including osprey, shorebirds, hawks, eagles, cormorants and ducks. Lucky visitors may see seals surfacing or lounging near the waters edge or even witness gray whales swimming by during spring migration.



Union Slough

Located in the Snohomish River estuary, Union Slough is a great location for wildlife lovers. This 24-acre estuarine marsh mudflat habitat creates a home for native species, including endangered Chinook salmon, shorebirds, Dungeness crab, and native plant species such as willows, flowering currant and nootka rose.

Waterfront Parks

Fish off the pier near the boat launch or enjoy a picnic in the park while taking in the sites and sounds of the waterfront. This location is a great place to watch for various birds and seals.

Trails & Waterfront



Marina District Waterfront Loop

Put on those walking shoes or grab your bike to enjoy Everett's newest public access path! This nearly four-mile pathway, located between 10th and 18th Streets off West Marine View Drive,

provides pedestrian access throughout the marina facilities along Everett's beautiful waterfront.

Pigeon Creek Trail

Located just behind the Port of Everett's shipping terminals, Pigeon Creek Trail offers a one-mile walking path where visitors can witness international trade in action while passing by the Port's facilities.

Union Slough Trail

Become one with nature while enjoying a beautiful walk through the 24-acre Union Slough marshland. Don't forget your binoculars! There is plenty to see at this site.
