

## Everett Shipyard Cleanup to Commence; Road Closure, Pile Driving & Dredging Scheduled

On August 18, the Port of Everett's contractor began work on the final phase of the Everett Shipyard environmental cleanup, and kicked-off the first phase of its marina revitalization efforts, the Central Dock Improvements.

The complex cleanup project, located along West Marine View Drive between 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> Streets, requires removing and replacing aging marine infrastructure to access and remove contaminated materials.

The in-water work, including primarily vibratory pile driving and dredging, must be completed during the allocated in-water work window (Aug. 15 - Feb. 15).

This work will result in construction related noise, which will be minimized whenever possible, as well as the temporary closure of 14<sup>th</sup> Street by the end of August. Traffic will be redirected to Port Gardner Way (13<sup>th</sup> Street) until the project wraps up in April 2015.



### About the Project

The Port is working in partnership with the Department of Ecology on the cleanup as a part of the state's Puget Sound Initiative. The project is funded by the Port of Everett, an Ecology Remedial Action Grant funded by a voter-approved tax on hazardous substances, and settlement funds from Everett Shipyard.

These cleanup efforts will restore the environmental health of the former industrial site, while allowing the Port to take necessary steps toward improving the economic vitality of the Central Marina in preparation for its broader revitalization project, Waterfront Place. - \$6.2 Million

The Everett Shipyard environmental cleanup is the final step in preparing for new development at the waterfront and achieves the following:

- **99.9%** of all contaminated materials removed
- **20,000** tons of contaminated soil removed
- **8,400** tons of concrete and asphalt recycled
- **11,000** cubic yards of contaminated sediment removed
- **700** creosote treated pilings removed
- **5** docks, **360** feet of bulkhead, and other marine structures removed
- **360** feet of environmentally-safe bulkhead reconstructed
- **360** feet of enhanced public access on the water
