

Major movement on environmental cleanup in the eastern corner of the Central Marina

Transformation is underway in the eastern corner of the Central Marina as the Port of Everett's major environmental cleanup at the former Everett Shipyard site moves forward.

What has been done so far?

- 220 creosote piles removed
- L, M and N docks removed
- Marine railway removed
- 14th Street Haulout removed
- 14th Street closed; access is available via Port Gardner Way (formerly 13th Street)

What's next?

Late-Sept.: Crews have begun vibratory sheet pile installation for the new bulkhead.

Early-Oct.: Dredging is scheduled to begin in early-Oct.

Construction Schedule

The contractor is scheduled to be on-site Monday thru Saturday; 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. Construction activity will continue through 2014, and is expected to wrap up in April 2015.

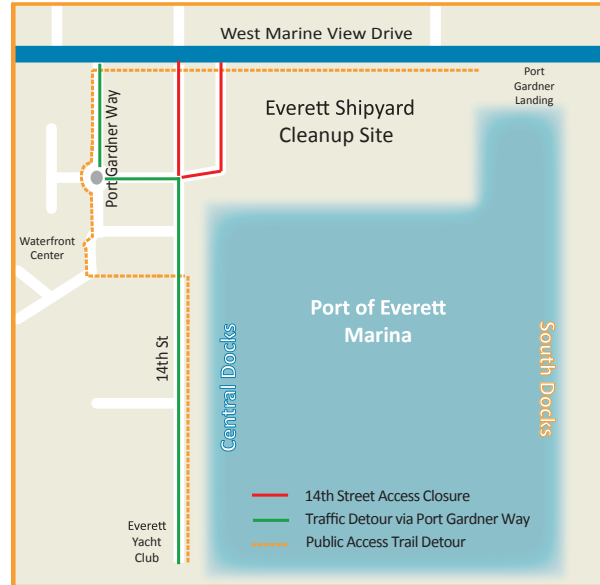
Mitigation Measures

The piles are being removed with vibratory extraction to minimize noise, and are quickly transported to an approved off-site disposal facility. Water quality monitoring is being conducted to ensure construction activity doesn't stir up contaminated sediment.
